How to find WWF International

WWF International's offices, located in a three-storey construction that was completely renovated in 1996/97, are located some 30 kilometres east of Geneva in the town of Gland. Gland lies between the shore of Lake Geneva and the Jura mountains, close to the large town of Nyon. Information on how to reach WWF International, by train or by car, is given below, with directional maps.

To reach WWF International by train


From Geneva the train arrives in Gland at platform 1 (quai 1). Use the underpass to cross the track, take the ramp on your left. From Lausanne the train arrives at platform 2 (quai 2), which is on the correct side for the relatively short walk to WWF. From the station take Rue du Perron. At the first intersection bear right along Rue Mauverney and at the next junction turn right into Rue du Midi. The WWF building is at the end of this road on the lefthand side (see map).

To reach WWF International by car

Coming from the Geneva direction, leave the motorway at the Gland exit and at the top of the exit road turn right onto Avenue du Mont-Blanc. Coming from the Lausanne direction, turn left onto Avenue du Mont-Blanc from the top of the exit road. Drive straight on through two roundabouts and under the railway bridge. At the third roundabout (where you will see the WWF International building on the lefthand side), turn left and then right into the signposted WWF carpark (see map).


